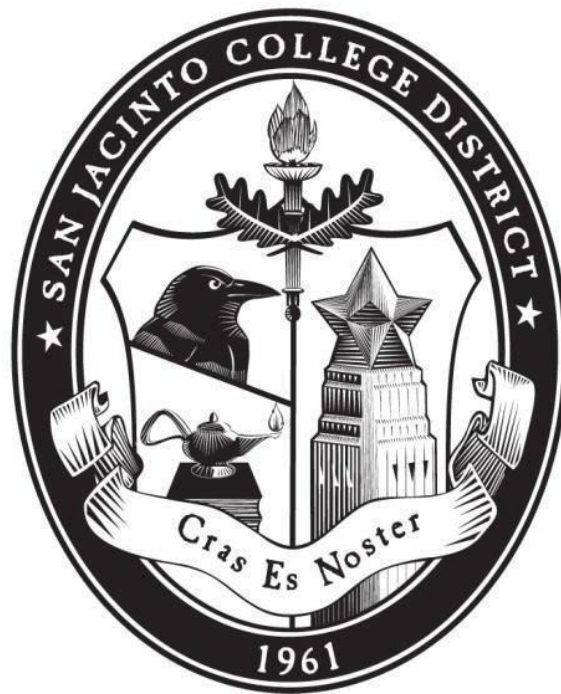

## Admissions Requirements for Application

- Current Licensure as Vocational/Practical Nurse (LVN/LPN) or Licensed Paramedic in Texas as
  - Work experience **not** required! Compact from other states are accepted.
- Must complete new ApplyTexas application with San Jacinto College Admissions at <https://www.applytexas.org/>
  - Acceptance requires submission of all **official transcripts** from any institution attended
  - Applicants are responsible for requesting transfer credit evaluation, please contact a Program Advisor.
- Degree Evaluation from SOS Student Account or requested from Program Advisors
  - It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Program Advisor.

- Complete the online ADN Transition Admission Application at [www.sanjac.edu](http://www.sanjac.edu)
  - Minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of **2.5** for all science college coursework

  - Photocopies (pdf document) of SJC Unofficial Transcript from SOS, if ever attended
  - For contingent acceptance, applicant may apply with up to 1 pre-requisite courses "in progress"
  - All academic courses must include a final grade of "C" or greater for eligibility
  - It is strongly recommended that the general education courses, which are part of the Plan of Study, be completed prior to the start of the nursing program.
  - If taking the general education courses during the nursing program, it is strongly recommended that those courses be taken online as an instructional modality, so as not to interfere with clinical rotations.

## All Courses:

**Please Note:** You may not retake a specific section of the TEAS. To provide an overall score and academic preparedness level for schools to use as admissions evaluation, the student must complete all four sections of the TEAS at the time of the exam. Some schools may only look at math and science scores for example, but the full exam must be completed for an accurate score.

# Immunization Requirements

After acceptance, you must upload documents to provide clinical clearance, as your records will be submitted for review by a Medical Review Officer of CastleBranch, an outside vendor system of medical document management.

CastleBranch is a required purchase **upon acceptance**, and will track documents, background clearance, and drug screen. The Blue Card and physical exam is only required once you are accepted into the program. More information will be provided. The cost is approximately \$100 and will require you to upload and manage your immunizations, proof of licensure, CPR certification, and proof of Texas Board of Nursing background clearance.

The student is responsible for keeping all records current during each level, prior to the beginning of each semester and current through the end of each semester. Failure to do so may be cause for dismissal. Once you have been accepted into the program, you will be given instructions with a code for our program on how to set up your CastleBranch account and drug screen.

*Please note: Drug screen results showing a dilute negative will not be valid and another drug screen will be required, and an additional payment of \$27.00 will be due to CastleBranch until clear. We do not recommend over hydrating on the day of test.*

## Immunizations/Titers Only

### Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR)

- Positive antibody titers for all 3 components or 2 doses (2nd dose administered 30 days following 1st dose) before final titer.
- Must provide dated proof in lab report or physician's verification.

### Varicella (Chicken Pox)

- Positive antibody titer, or 2 doses (2nd dose administered 30 days following 1st dose)
- Must provide dated proof in lab report or physician's verification. History of the disease is not accepted.

### Hepatitis B

- Positive antibody titers after receiving immunization of the series. Series must be completed prior to clinical rotations.
- Must provide dated proof in lab report or physician's verification.

### Hepatitis C    **NEW REQUIREMENT FOR SPRING 2022 AND FORWARD**

- Negative screening required.
- Must provide dated proof in lab report or physician's verification.

## Must Provide Proof of Innoculation:

### TB Skin Test

There must be documentation of one of the following:

- TB skin test within the last 12 months  
- or -
- Chest X-Ray results within the last 2 years

### Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis (TD/Tdap)

There must be documentation of TDap or a Td booster within the past 10 years.

### Influenza

There must be documentation of one of the following:

- Flu shot administered during the current flu season  
- or -
- Declination waiver from a physician's office. WE DO NOT provide the waiver.

*Students enrolling in San Jacinto College programs with external learning experiences (i.e., clinical, practicum, externship, cooperative, etc.) will be required to comply with the immunization requirements and policies of the clinical/external learning sites to engage in all clinical/external learning experiences. Vaccination requirements at clinical/external learning sites are implemented pursuant to the independent authority of such facilities and are not mandated by San Jacinto College. Failure to meet the immunization requirements mandated by clinical/external learning sites may limit a student's ability to complete the program and/or may delay the student's graduation date. San Jacinto College does not process exemptions, and students should address potential vaccination exemptions directly with the clinical/external learning site.*

Your application to our program subjects you to allow The Texas Board of Nurse Examiners to randomly select any applicant to an additional required background check, including an additional cost for fingerprinting, performed by IDENTOGO.

For any criminal offense, including those pending appeal, have you:

- A. been convicted of a misdemeanor?
  - B. been convicted of a felony?
  - C. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty?
  - D. received deferred adjudication?
  - E. been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty?
  - F. been sentenced to serve jail or prison time? court-ordered confinement?
  - G. been granted pre-trial diversion?
  - H. been arrested or have any pending criminal charges?
  - I. been cited or charged with any violation of the law?
  - J. been subject of a court-martial; Article 15 violation; or received any form of military judgment/punishment/action?
- (You may only exclude Class C misdemeanor traffic violations.)

**NOTE: Expunged and Sealed Offenses:** While expunged or sealed offenses, arrests, tickets, or citations need not be disclosed, it is your responsibility to ensure the offense, arrest, ticket or citation has, in fact, been expunged or sealed. It is recommended that you submit a copy of the Court Order expunging or sealing the record in question to our office with your application. Failure to reveal an offense, arrest, ticket, or citation that is not in fact expunged or sealed may subject your license to a disciplinary order and/or fine. Non-disclosure of relevant offenses raises questions related to truthfulness and character. (See 22 TAC §213.27)

**NOTE: Orders of Non-Disclosure:** Pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code § 552.142(b), if you have criminal matters that are the subject of an order of non-disclosure you are not required to reveal those criminal matters on this form. However, a criminal matter that is the subject of an order of non-disclosure may become a character and fitness issue. Pursuant to the Gov't Code chapter 411, the Texas Nursing Board is entitled to access criminal history record information that is the subject of an order of non-disclosure. If the Board discovers a criminal matter that is the subject of an order of non-disclosure, even if you properly did not reveal that matter, the Board may require you to provide information about any conduct that raises issues of character and fitness.

1) Are you currently the target or subject of a grand jury or governmental agency investigation?

2) Has any licensing authority ever refused to issue you a license or ever revoked, annulled, canceled, accepted surrender of, suspended, placed on probation, refused to renew a professional license, certificate or multi-state privilege held by you now or previously, or ever fined, censured, reprimanded or otherwise disciplined you?

\*3) Within the past five (5) years have you been addicted to and/or treated for the use of alcohol or any other drug?

\*4) Within the past five (5) years have you been diagnosed with, treated, or hospitalized for schizophrenia and/or psychotic disorder, bipolar disorder, paranoid personality disorder, antisocial personality disorder, or borderline personality disorder?

\*Pursuant to the Occupations Code §301.207, information, including diagnosis and treatment, regarding an individual's physical or mental condition, intemperate use of drugs or alcohol, or chemical dependency and information regarding an individual's criminal history is confidential to the same extent that information collected as part of an investigation is confidential under the Texas Occupations Code §301.466. If you are licensed as an LVN in the State of Texas and are currently participating in the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses you may have exceptions reviewed by the Texas Board of Nursing regarding these circumstances.

## **Core Performance Standards for Successful Program Progression**

Applicants admitted into the SJC ADN Transition Program are expected to perform the minimum, but not limited to, common nursing technical standards and essential functions. Students must be able to apply the knowledge and skills necessary to function in a variety of classroom, lab and/or clinical situations while providing the essential competencies of the ADN program.

Please review the technical standards and essential functions below required for program admission and progression.

<b>ISSUE</b>	<b>STANDARD</b>	<b>EXAMPLES (not inclusive)</b>
<b>Critical Thinking</b>	Critical thinking sufficient for clinical reasoning and judgment.	Independent decision- making which results in competent client assessment, accurate data analysis and problem identification, appropriate treatment plans and interventions, evaluation of client outcomes.
<b>Interpersonal Abilities</b>	Interpersonal abilities sufficient to interact with individuals, families, and groups from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds.	Therapeutic interactions with clients and their families stressed by illness, death, life situations, and cultural differences.
<b>Communication</b>	Communication abilities sufficient for interaction with others in verbal and written form.	Accurate interpretation of verbal and/or written instructions, communication of patient responses, documentation of therapeutic procedures, health education, professional consultation with other health care providers.
<b>Mobility</b>	Physical abilities sufficient to move from room to room, walk in hallways, maneuver in small spaces, and lift patients as needed.	Ability to ambulate to and from departments and patient rooms, to care for all assigned clients, to assist in patient transport, to administer CPR.
<b>Motor Skills</b>	Gross and fine motor abilities sufficient to provide safe and effective nursing care.	Performance of vital signs and psychomotor nursing skills, calibration and use equipment, physical assessment.

<b>Hearing</b>	<b>Auditory ability sufficient to monitor and assess health needs.</b>	<b>Auscultation of BP, breath sounds, heart sounds, bowel sounds, ability to hear alarms, emergency signals, call bells, phones, cries for help; ability to converse with patients, family, and staff</b>
<b>Visual</b>	<b>Visual ability sufficient for observation and assessment necessary in nursing care.</b>	<b>Reading patient charts/flow sheet/monitors, preparation and administration of medications, assessment of patient skin color, reading thermometers.</b>
<b>Tactile</b>	<b>Tactile ability sufficient for physical assessment and to provide nursing intervention.</b>	<b>Performance of palpation, administration of injections, initiation of IVs and other therapeutic interventions</b>
<b>Strength/Stamina</b>	<b>Sufficient stamina to provide care and related responsibilities for extended periods of time (8-12 hours)</b>	<b>Ability to perform shift work, lift 25 pounds from standing position, ability to bend, position, and lift</b>

- Focused attention to detail
- Interest and aptitude for math and science
- Flexible and adaptable to unexpected changes
- Strong motivation to learn and read
- Well-developed study skills
- Efficient time management skills
- Good problem-solving and decision-making skills
- Ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds
- Patience, perseverance, and professionalism

Texas Administrative Code Rule 213.27(a)

“Good professional character is the integrated pattern of personal, academic and occupational behaviors which, in the judgment of the Board, indicates that an individual is able to consistently conform his or her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's rules and regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice including, but not limited to, behaviors indicating honesty, accountability, trustworthiness, reliability, and integrity.” Prospective students must demonstrate good professional characteristics to be eligible for program admission and licensure with the Texas BON.

\*\*Note: Effective January 1, 1996, a person who has been convicted of a felony may be disqualified for obtaining licensure as a Registered Nurse. If you have ANY questions regarding past incidents, call the Texas BON at (512) 305- 7400. Since August 2004, a criminal background check and/or drug screen has been conducted by a designated investigative agency at the expense of the student. Effective January 8, 2008, the background check must be completed before registering for classes and only those applicants with a clear background will be eligible to register.
